

## Mortlake South Wind Farm Turbine Component Transport and Delivery Information - as at 02.09.2020

The transportation of turbine components into the Mortlake South Wind Farm will commence in September. These deliveries mark the beginning of onsite wind turbine erection and assembly - an exciting milestone for the project!

## **Transport and Delivery**

Wind turbine components are anticipated to start arriving in September (weather permitting). The initial tower sections will be transported from the Port of Melbourne; whilst the remaining towers will be delivered from Keppel Prince in Portland. The blades, nacelles and hub components will be transported from the Port of Portland. As these components are large, they will travel in convoy with escort vehicles. Deliveries may occur on Mondays to Saturdays; with different components scheduled to arrive at various times of day.

Due to VicRoads over-dimensional permit requirements, the blades will be travelling at night from the Port of Portland. These components will depart the Port of Portland after 3am and arrive onsite between 6 - 7am. All deliveries will await normal working hours prior to being unloaded, however you may still see lights and movement at the site compound at varying hours. The timing of these deliveries will ensure the safety of road users.

## **Current Delivery Schedule**

A summary of anticipated timing and associated haulage routes are as follows:

- Tower sections (Port of Melbourne)
  - Delivery from mid- September.
  - Daytime travel: Port Melbourne to Mortlake via Lake Bolac.
- Nacelles and Hubs (Port of Portland)
  - Delivery from mid-September
  - Daytime travel: Portland to Mortlake via Warrnambool (Southern Route).
- Tower sections (Keppel Prince, Portland)
  - Delivery from October
  - Daytime travel: Keppel Prince Portland to Mortlake via Lake Bolac (Northern Route).
- Turbine Blades (Port of Portland)
  - Delivery from November
  - **Overnight travel (arrival onsite between 3am and 5am).** Port of Portland to Mortlake via Lake Bolac (Northern Route).




Figure 1. Tower Sections Route from Port Melbourne to Mortlake via Lake Bolac (Northern Route)




Figure 2. Route of Nacelles and Hubs from Port of Portland to Mortlake (Southern Route)







Figure 3. Tower Sections Route from Keppel Prince to Mortlake (Northern Route)
