

GUNNING WIND FARM

Welcome to the 19th edition of the Gunning Wind Farm Newsletter. This newsletter provides information and updates about the project. ACCIONA Energía looks forward to a continuing positive relationship with the local community and thanks you for your interest in the project.

Gunning Wind Farm was ACCIONA Energía's third wind farm built in Australia and has been operational since 2011. It's located in the Cullerin Range, north-east of Gunning, and is home to 31 wind turbines capable of producing 46.5 megawatts of electricity. That's enough to power 36,000 households.

Project Update

This year there were some significant staffing changes for Gunning Wind Farm. Craig Simon finished his time with ACCIONA Energía after over twelve years with the company, in his role as Site Manager at Gunning. We thank him for his significant contribution to Gunning Wind Farm and its community, and wish him all the best in his future endeavours.

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We are currently in the process of appointing a new person to this role and will send out notification to the community and our key stakeholders once this is finalised.





Sponsorship

2023 marked the thirteenth year of ACCIONA Energía's Gunning Wind Farm Sponsorship Program, with over \$165,000 donated to local community groups, schools, sporting clubs, and not-for-profits since the program's inception in 2011.

In July, we announced over \$45,000 in funding across 13 local community organisations as part of this year's annual Sponsorship Program. Managing the risk of fire

With temperatures set to rise this summer, we want to reassure our local community that ACCIONA Energía recognises our responsibility to minimise the risk of fire at Gunning Wind Farm. We also have an important role to play in assisting emergency services in the case of a fire in the vicinity of the wind farm. The key management measures implemented at the wind farm are listed below.

Listening to the experts

If Gunning Wind Farm is in the path of a fire, ACCIONA Energía will follow the advice of the State Control Centre and other emergency authorities.

Bushfire Mitigation Plan

The objective of this BMP is to mitigate any uncontrolled risks of fire ignition that have the potential to initiate bushfires during the operational and maintenance activities of Gunning Wind Farm. This includes, but is not limited to, the following mitigation measures.



Wind turbines

- All turbine hardstands are covered in crushed rock, kept free of litter, rubbish and other flammable items
- Weeds are regularly removed



Underground power cables

- · All underground cables are accurately surveyed
- Any work involving excavation is controlled within 6.4m of any underground cable route



Substation

- The yards of all collector substations are covered with crushed rock or bitumen to reduce growth of vegetation
- A reduced fuel area is maintained around the exterior of the perimeter fence
- Conductors are spaced out so they do not clash
- Lightning protection poles are installed to prevent strikes inside the switchyard



Fire-fighting equipment and vehicles

- Firefighting equipment is provided in all vehicles and collector substations, adequate to enable small fires to be extinguished
- Turbines are designed with fire detection systems, lightning protection devices, monitoring systems that detect temperature increases in the turbine, fully closed electrical equipment and circuit breakers and fuses to interrupt any electrical faults
